First Reading: Isaiah 55:10-13

¹⁰ "My word is like the snow and the rain that come down from the sky to water the earth. They make the crops grow and provide seed for planting and food to eat. ¹¹ So also will be the word that I speak— it will not fail to do what I plan for it; it will do everything I send it to do. ¹² "You will leave Babylon with joy; you will be led out of the city in peace. The mountains and hills will burst into singing, and the trees will shout for joy. ¹³ Cypress trees will grow where now there are briars; myrtle trees will come up in place of thorns. This will be a sign that will last forever, a reminder of what I, the LORD, have done."

Second Reading: Acts 8:26-40

²⁶ An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get ready and go south to the road that goes from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This road is not used nowadays.) ²⁷⁻²⁸ So Philip got ready and went. Now an Ethiopian eunuch, who was an important official in charge of the treasury of the queen of Ethiopia, was on his way home. He had been to Jerusalem to worship God and was going back home in his carriage. As he rode along, he was reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹ The Holy Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to that carriage and stay close to it." ³⁰ Philip ran over and heard him reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah. He asked him, "Do you

understand what you are reading?”³¹ The official replied, “How can I understand unless someone explains it to me?” And he invited Philip to climb up and sit in the carriage with him.³² The passage of scripture which he was reading was this: “He was like a sheep that is taken to be slaughtered, like a lamb that makes no sound when its wool is cut off. He did not say a word.”³³ He was humiliated, and justice was denied him. No one will be able to tell about his descendants, because his life on earth has come to an end.”³⁴ The official asked Philip, “Tell me, of whom is the prophet saying this? Of himself or of someone else?”³⁵ Then Philip began to speak; starting from this passage of scripture, he told him the Good News about Jesus.³⁶ As they traveled down the road, they came to a place where there was some water, and the official said, “Here is some water. What is to keep me from being baptized?”³⁸ The official ordered the carriage to stop, and both Philip and the official went down into the water, and Philip baptized him.³⁹ When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord took Philip away. The official did not see him again, but continued on his way, full of joy.⁴⁰ Philip found himself in Azotus; he went on to Caesarea, and on the way he preached the Good News in every town.

The Word of the Lord

Gospel: Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

That same day Jesus left the house and went to the lakeside, where he sat down to teach.² The crowd that gathered around him was so large that he got into a boat and sat in it, while the crowd stood on the shore.³ He used parables to tell them many things. “Once there was a man who went out to sow grain.⁴ As he scattered the seed in the field, some of it fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up.⁵ Some of it fell on rocky ground, where there was little soil. The seeds soon sprouted, because the soil wasn't deep.⁶ But when the sun came up, it burned the young plants; and because the roots had not grown deep enough, the plants soon dried up.⁷ Some of the seed fell among thorn bushes, which grew up and choked the plants.⁸ But some seeds fell in good soil, and the plants bore grain: some had one hundred grains, others sixty, and others thirty.”⁹ And Jesus concluded, “Listen, then, if you have ears!”¹⁸ “Listen, then, and learn what the parable of the sower means.¹⁹ Those who hear the message about the Kingdom but do not understand it are like the seeds that fell along the path. The Evil One comes and snatches away what was sown in them.²⁰ The seeds that fell on rocky

ground stand for those who receive the message gladly as soon as they hear it. ²¹ But it does not sink deep into them, and they don't last long. So when trouble or persecution comes because of the message, they give up at once. ²² The seeds that fell among thorn bushes stand for those who hear the message; but the worries about this life and the love for riches choke the message, and they don't bear fruit. ²³ And the seeds sown in the good soil stand for those who hear the message and understand it: they bear fruit, some as much as one hundred, others sixty, and others thirty."
